The Rep Team Committee was in place again and whilst the COVID situation and wet weather decimated the competition aspect of the rep season, their preparation work was excellent. Due to COVID restrictions face to face interaction between the Rep Team Committee and the Board was limited but Pat Batiste did address the Board in respect to representative refereeing commitments.

General items Local Competitions

Due to COVID restrictions sign on sheets in the summer competition were supposed to be completed by team managers. Unfortunately, this did not occur in a large number of cases. We tried to implement a checking system but it was difficult to get someone to stay with this job as it was very unrewarding due to the lack of assistance from a number of team managers.

As usual we continued to have trouble getting all players to register prior to playing. While the registration process worked well with the majority of newer sides, the culture of teams who have been playing for a number of years is proving difficult to change despite constant pushing. This is an aspect that will need to be addressed by the incoming Board.

The club ran close to capacity in the senior Summer competition based on the number of fields available. The junior comp has room for more teams and the number of teams participating in the older divisions is a concern for the Board. The junior coaching clinic is one initiative that was continued this year to try and invigorate the junior competition. Obviously, it will take time to bring these young ones through and we need to have other initiatives in place now in order to retain them when they get older.

This year we introduced a maximum number of rep players to be able to play in a team. Hopefully this will mean that the reduction in the ability difference between the teams will mean a healthier retention. We had an U8s comp for the first time and apparently all teams enjoyed the experience.

This year we had 56 junior teams (an increase of 8 teams). We had 33 Senior Opens, 12 Mixed and 6 Women's teams.

The winter comp this year only has 8 teams which is a bit of a disappointment but the weather has probably played a part in this. We have introduced a handicapping system and this has meant that there have been no blowouts in the scores.

Conclusion

Whilst the majority of teams do the right thing it continues to be a disappointment that not all teams feel they have to comply with the rules. Thank you to the members who have been supportive of our efforts. A special thank you to Nicola Wines who makes my job a lot easier by being available to help with administrative tasks.
